1.	PAYMENT OF FEES All prescribed fees are to be paid promptly by all students. Each JS3, SS3, IGCSE and A Level students must pay all school fees in full for the session before being registered for WASSCE, NECO, IGCSE & A-Level examinations.		New students will not be registered until they pay all the prescribed fees in full. Students who neglect, refuse or fail to pay fees on the day of resumption shall not be allowed entrance into the school premises.
2.	LATENESS TO SCHOOL The school gate will be closed at 7.55a.m on each school day and throughout the assembly period. Late-comers may be allowed in after the general school assembly.		Students who still arrive after 8.00a.m will be punished. The type of punishment to be meted out will be at the discretion of School Management. Students who arrive after 8:30am will not be allowed into the School for the day.
3a	CLASSES: Students must: attendschool and classes regularly and punctually. If any student is absent from school, the parent(s) should send a written note/letter to the Principal within 24 hours.	i.	Without a written note/letter, no make-up test shall be given to the student.

ACTIVITIES Day-students are not allowed to remain in the school premises after 5.00p.m except as permitted by the Principal or teacher-on-duty, or during activities organized by the students with due approval of the Principal/School management. Such activities shall not go beyond 7.00p.m.		Any Student who violates this rule shall be made to serve punishment as recommended by the Principal/Vice Principal. SCHEDULE 1. INTERPRETATION

In these rules and regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively.

"Board of Governors" Means the body constituted for the running and management of the school.

"Boarder" means a student other than a day student who resides in the boarding house provided by and under the control of the school.

"boarding house" means the dwelling place of students within the school premises or any other place (s) so designated by and which are under the control of the school.

"dormitory" means the hall of residence provided for male and female students resident in the school.

"dormitory supervisor" means any person who is saddled with the responsibility of supervising the activities of students in the dormitories and boarding house after the school hours.

"matron" means a female teacher or any other female staff who is made to see to the welfare and general administration of female boarders.

"notice" means notice in writing.

"Students Disciplinary Committee" means the committee set up and saddled with the responsibility of correcting the misbehaviour of students.
